School's in — and FREE — for summer at EVIT

The East Valley Institute of Technology will offer two free summer school sessions from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. June 10-27 and July 8-25 for high school students who have registered to attend EVIT this fall. The June class will cover Economics and the July class will be Government – two courses that are usually taken in a student's senior year.

Both classes will be taught at EVIT's Dr. A. Keith Crandell (Main) Campus, 1601 W. Main St., Mesa.

Assistant Superintendent David Schapira said EVIT is offering the summer classes at the request of school districts. EVIT serves students from 10 districts – Mesa, Scottsdale, Gilbert, Chandler, Tempe, Higley, Apache Junction, Queen Creek, Fountain Hills and J.O. Combs – as well as charter, online and home-schooled students.

"Some of our districts asked us to offer summer school to ensure that students are able to attend EVIT and graduate high school on time," Schapira said.

So far, Scottsdale, Apache Junction and Fountain Hills unified school districts and Tempe Union High School District have agreed to accept the EVIT summer school courses for credit if their students enroll.

Students in other districts served by EVIT – Mesa, Gilbert, Chandler, Queen Creek, Higley and J.O. Combs – can apply but will not be enrolled until their home district approves acceptance of the credit.

The Economics class will be taught by longtime Arcadia High School teacher Clayton Guy. The Scottsdale district is going to provide a second teacher for the Government class.

Both classes are being offered at no cost to the student or district. The only requirement is that the student be registered to attend at EVIT this fall.
